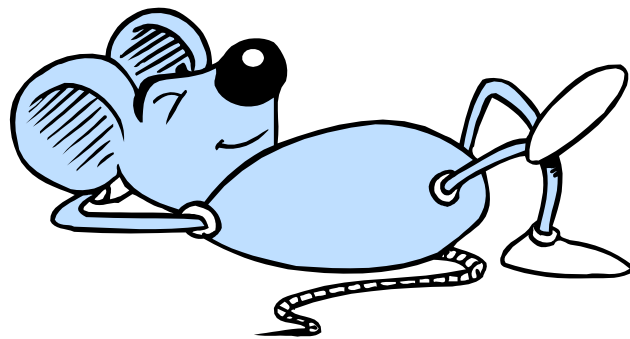

The Christian Church begins observing the Lenten Season at the end of this month. For many of us, the Lenten season invites us to “give up” something and “sacrifice” for the 40 days between Ash Wednesday (February 22) and Easter Sunday (April 8). It is a new beginning to try and improve ourselves or grow in our Spiritual walk.

Others of us continue our lives as normal and do not even acknowledge that the Church has entered a new season. Sure, we might notice that the colors on the altar have changed or the sermon focus is a bit different, but otherwise we do not attempt to make changes to our lives and try to grow spiritually.

This Lent, our worship themes will focus upon personal holiness and social justice. We will focus on how personal holiness and social justice are often dealt with separately within the Christian church. God commands us to “GO” and serve while we continue to grow spiritually.

Book Discussion/Bible Study:

The Gospel according to Mark is the only Gospel that outlines, day-by-day, the week leading up to the Resurrection. We’ll be reading about and discussing the daily events of Holy Week, using Scripture and the book “*The Last Week*” by Marcus Borg and John Dominic Crossan as a springboard. We’ll be meeting on **Mondays at 7pm from February 13th through April 2nd** in the Multi-purpose room at HUMC. We will be discussing Palm Sunday during our first session, so please read the introduction and the first chapter prior to that. Books will be available at the Church office. The Adult Sunday School Class will be reading and discussing “If the Church Were Christian” by Philip Gulley. This study is open to anyone, whether you’ve ever been involved in the class previously or not. Books are available

During this Lenten season, members from across the Upper New York Annual Conference will come together to celebrate Africa University and reflect on our commitment to raise \$1 million to endow a scholarship fund.

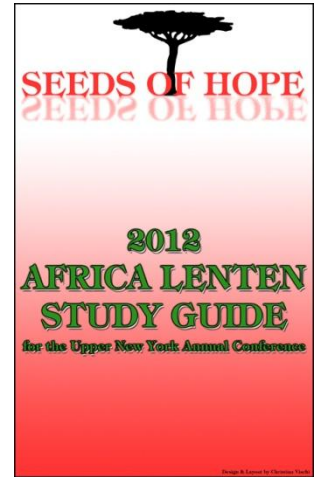
An online Bible study: "Planting the Seeds of Hope," developed by the North Texas Conference and adapted with permission for our conference, will offer participants a daily devotional as well as a contribution challenge.

The Bible study was written by United Methodist clergy and laity and is available for free as a PDF at the **Upper New York Conference website: www.unyumc.org**.

Lent is a season of 40 days, not counting Sundays, which begins on Ash Wednesday and ends on Holy Saturday. The 40 days represents the time Jesus spent in the wilderness, enduring the temptation of Satan.

Ronald D. Henderson, of the Custer Road UMC in Plano, Texas, notes in the Bible study about Jesus' time in the wilderness: "It took 40 days for God to complete what God wanted to do in Jesus' life, so that Jesus would be filled with God's Spirit in order to do the mission God has assigned to Him as Savior of the world."

That day's challenge is to count the steps you take from your car to your church's sanctuary and make a donation to AU for each.



2012 School of Christian Mission schedule announced



It's almost time to return to school.

The 2012 School of Christian Mission schedule for the conference has been released; three schools are planned:

- Region 2 will be held July 13-15 at Cazenovia College, Cazenovia, facilitated by Dean Phyllis Doan (programs will be available for women, men, youth and children)
- Region 3 will be held July 26-28 at the Asbury Camp & Retreat Center, Silver Lake, facilitated by Dean Ruth Cleveland
- Region 1 will be held Sept. 14-16 at the Silver Bay YMCA (on Lake George), Silver Bay, facilitated by Dean Linda VanSchaick

Three studies will be offered at each region: "Immigration and the Bible," "Haiti: Challenges and Hopes" and a study on the issue of "Poverty."

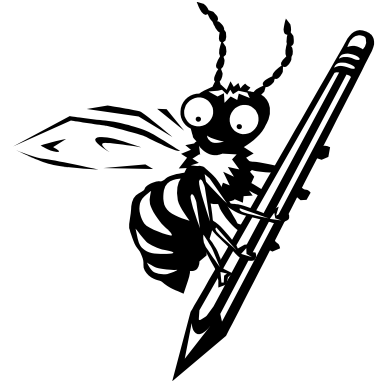

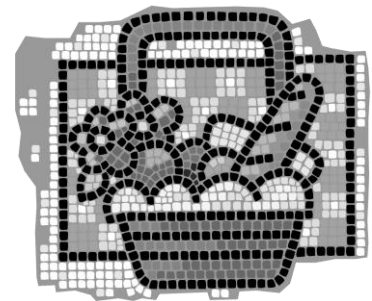

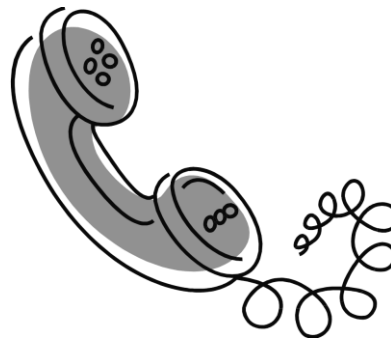
DID YOU KNOW . . .

The third and newest prayer support group is the **HUMC Facebook Prayer Group**. It is described as follows: This is not a prayer chain because everyone sees the prayer at the same time. It is actually a group sharing prayers. It is requested that all postings be in the form of a prayer, akin to a circle of people holding hands and someone offering a prayer and others in the group supporting that prayer with more prayers.

The "Hilton United Methodist Church NY Facebook Prayer Group" is a "Closed" group. That means that anyone on Facebook can see the group and who is in it, but only members of the group can see the postings.

If you have a Facebook account and want to enter the group, from your Facebook account you type "hilton" into the member search box. HUMC Endowment Fund Committee Meeting Minutes

Meeting Date: 1/25/2012

Pastor Jennifer Green opened meeting with prayer.

Jim Lee was elected Committee Chair.

Ed Earnhart was elected Committee Secretary.

Jim Lee presented status of Endowment Funds (**See page 2**)

Ed Earnhart presented HUMC plan to repay HUMCEF loan originated on 6/30/2008. The principal on this loan was \$5,000. The current principal plus accrued interest is \$5,763.26 as of today. Ed proposed to begin repayment today for a term of 12 months at 4% interest. The monthly payment would be \$490.69. **See page 3.**

Al Blossom motioned to cancel the accrued interest on the said loan above and to change the interest rate to 0%. Motion was seconded by Steve Clark and carried unanimously. **See page 4.**

Ed Earnhart mentioned that member loan repayment would be complete in March 2012.

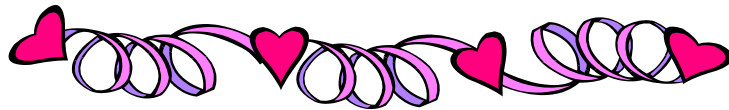

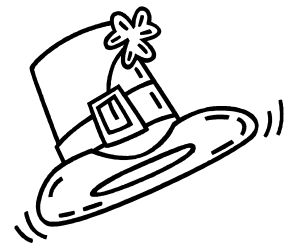

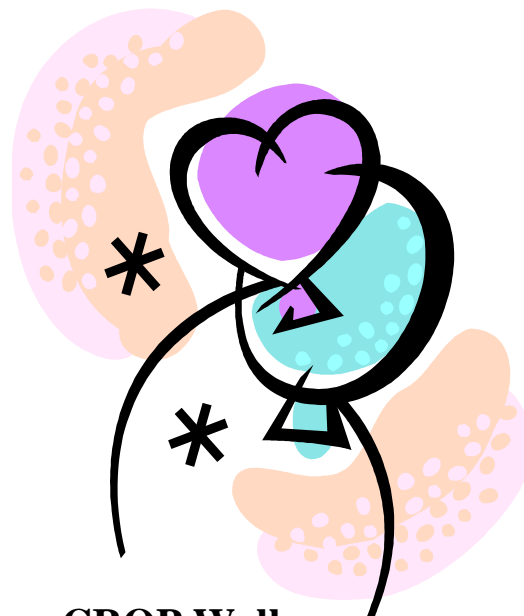
